

How to Cite a Source from Opposing Viewpoints

The following is an example of a citation directly from an article from Opposing Viewpoints. It has everything needed to be used in the citation except “Keyword: Abortion” at the end. It also is not spaced correctly. It should be double-spaced and have a hanging indent. However, all of your entries from the internet will have Dundee High School followed by the date you accessed them, followed by the web address, which you may shorten if you use the key word. See how it is retyped underneath it. The last entry is the way your entries should look.
